Type

This product is an unsecured debt instrument governed by English law.

Objectives

This product is designed to provide a defined return when the product is redeemed (either at maturity or when redeemed early). It is possible for the product to be automatically redeemed early based on pre-defined conditions. If the product is not redeemed early, the capital redemption amount is linked to the performance of the Reference Underlying. Your capital will be fully at risk when investing in this product.

The Reference Underlying is the Underlying with the lowest observed level on the relevant observation date.

The Best Performing Underlying is the Underlying with the highest observed level on the relevant observation date.

Automatic Early Redemption

On any Early Redemption Observation Date, if the level of the Reference Underlying is at or above the Early Redemption Barrier, the product will be redeemed early and you will receive:

- 100% of the Nominal Value plus the Early Redemption Coupon multiplied by the number of semi-annual periods the product has elapsed since inception.

Final Redemption

At maturity, provided that the product has not been redeemed early, you will receive a final redemption amount.

- If the Final Level of the Reference Underlying is at or above the Final Barrier, you will receive:

100% of the Nominal Value plus the Final Coupon.

- If the Final Level of the Reference Underlying is below the Final Barrier and at or above the Capital Barrier, you will receive:

100% of the Nominal Value.

- If the Final Level of the Reference Underlying is below the Capital Barrier but the Final Level of the Best Performing Underlying is at or above the Knock-In Barrier, you will receive:

100% of the Nominal Value

- Otherwise, if the Final Level of the Reference Underlying is below the Capital Barrier and the Final Level of the Best Performing Underlying is below the Knock-In Barrier, you will receive the level of the Reference Underlying multiplied by the Nominal Value. In this scenario, you will suffer a partial or total loss of your invested amount.

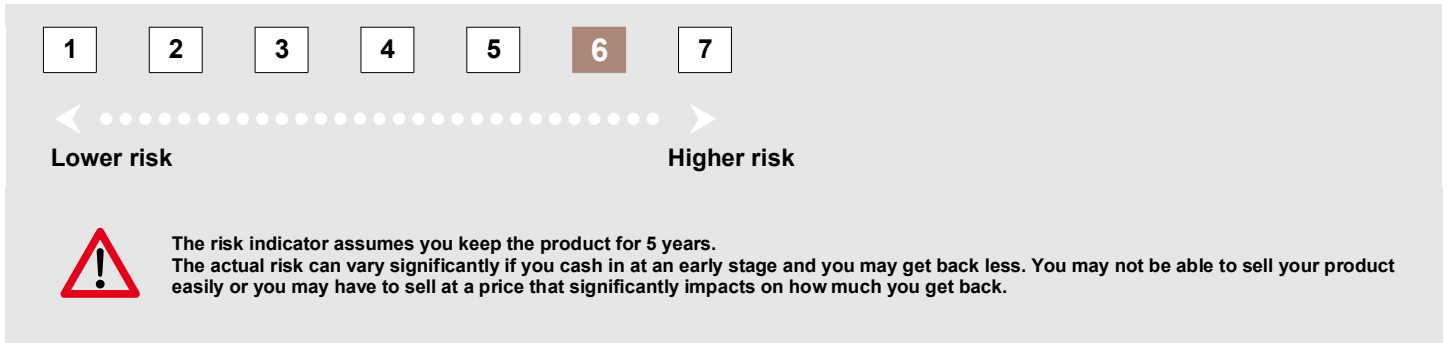

HOW LONG SHOULD I HOLD IT AND CAN I TAKE MONEY OUT EARLY?

Recommended Holding Period: 5 years, which corresponds to the product maturity.

Under normal market conditions, Société Générale or an entity of its group ensures a daily secondary market during the life of the product with a maximum bid-offer spread of 1%. If you want to sell this product before the Maturity Date, the price of the product will depend on market parameters at the time you wish to sell and you may sustain a partial or total capital loss.
