

# **Key Information Document**

#### **Purpose**

This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

#### What is this product?

The product is in the form of a note issued under English law. It is not an interest bearing security. The payment obligations of the product manufacturer are guaranteed by The Goldman Sachs Group, Inc.

Term Objectives The product has a fixed term and will be due on July 2, 2029, subject to an early redemption.

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The product provides the potential for capital growth and does not pay interest. What you will receive at the end of the term of the product is not certain and will depend on the performance of the index Solactive Core US Diversified Portfolio EUR Hedged 6% VT Index (the **underlying asset**). The term of the product will end no later than July 2, 2029. However, the product may terminate early depending on the performance of the underlying asset. Each note has a face value of EUR 1,000. The issue price is 100.00% of the face value. The product will be listed on Luxembourg Stock Exchange (Main Segment). The issue date is July 31, 2024.

**Autocall feature:** If the closing price of the underlying asset on any autocall observation date is at or above the autocall barrier, the product will terminate on the corresponding autocall payment date. In this case, you will receive the autocall payment shown below for each note that you hold.

# Repayment at maturity:

This section applies only if no autocall occurs as described above.

On July 2, 2029, for each note that you hold you will receive the difference between (i) EUR 2,000.00 (i.e., 200.00% of the face value) multiplied by (A) the closing price of the underlying asset on June 25, 2029 divided by (B) the initial reference price of the underlying asset and (ii) EUR 1,000.00. However, if this is less than EUR 1,000.00, you will receive EUR 1,000.00 (the minimum payment).

The initial reference price of the underlying asset is the closing price on July 24, 2024.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the underlying asset, the product and the product manufacturer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

# Intended retail investor

The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who:

- have the ability to make an informed investment decision through sufficient knowledge and understanding of the product and its specific risks and rewards, with experience of investing in and/or holding a number of similar products providing a similar market exposure;
- 2. seek capital growth, expect the movement in the underlying asset to perform in a way that generates a favourable return, have an investment horizon of the recommended holding period specified below and understand that the product may terminate early;

# What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until July 2, 2029. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to sell your product easily or may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class. This takes into account two elements: (1) the market risk - that the potential losses for future performance are rated at a low level; and (2) the credit risk - that poor market conditions are deemed very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

You are entitled to receive back at least 100.00% of the face value of the product. Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain. However, this protection against future market performance will not apply if you cash in before July 2, 2029. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

Inflation erodes the purchasing value of cash over time and this may result in the decline in real terms of any capital reimbursed.

What you will get from this product depends on future market performance. Market developments in the future are uncertain and cannot be accurately predicted.

The favourable, moderate and unfavourable scenarios represent possible outcomes that have been calculated based on simulations using the reference asset's performance over up to 5 past years. #### Costs over time

## How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

#### Recommended holding period: 4 years and 11 months

The recommended holding period for the product is 4 years and 11 months as the product is designed to be held until maturity; however the product may terminate early due to an autocall or an extraordinary event. You have no contractual right to terminate the product prior to maturity. The manufacturer is under no obligation to make a secondary market in the product, but may repurchase the product prior to maturity on a case-by-case basis. In such circumstances, the price quoted will reflect a bid-ask spread and any costs associated with unwinding the hedging arrangements of the manufacturer in connection with the product. In addition, the person who sold you the product may charge you brokerage fees when you sell the product.
